



Community College Colleague Spring 2009 Update

Office of Admissions and Records Announcements

- Transfer decision letters will be sent between February and May for Fall enrollment and between October and November for Spring enrollment.
- Newly admitted transfer students are required to submit an Intent to Enroll Form in order to register for Fall 2009 classes and be invited to Transfer Student Orientation. Transfer students are encouraged to submit this form on-line. The earlier that newly admitted transfer students submit this form, the earlier that students will be able to register and be invited to Transfer Student Orientation. The deadline for the Intent to Enroll Form for Fall 2009 transfer admits is June 1st.

University & College Updates

- The Architectural Studies program has changed to a Bachelor of Science degree program in Architecture.
- The Department of Movement Science is now the Department of Kinesiology and Nutrition. The Kinesiology department offers concentrations in Movement Sciences and Exercise and Fitness.
- The College of Nursing has raised the minimum transfer GPA to a 2.75/4.00 scale for admission consideration. In addition, the College of Nursing now requires the supplemental application materials to be submitted electronically. - The Human Nutrition program has changed to Nutrition. In addition, the Bachelor of Science in Nutrition program now requires a Biochemistry course to be completed in order for students to be considered for admission.
- The Economics major is now offered exclusively in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences for new undergraduate applicants to UIC.
- The Criminal Justice Department has changed its name to Criminology, Law, and Justice
- The College of Urban Planning and Public Affairs implemented a new BA program in Urban and Public Affairs (UPA) Fall 2007. The UPA program prepares students to enter urban professions and graduate professional education programs with knowledge and understanding of the complexity and diversity of the urban environment and the policy and management processes that affect it. Graduating UPA students will enter careers in public and nonprofit service, commerce, real estate or other city planning

activities. Students entering graduate education will be prepared to study in related fields such as public administration, urban planning, public health, law, public relations, international studies, sociology, political science, or peace and social justice studies. Admission to the BA Program in UPA requires junior standing (completion of at least 60 semester hours at the time of enrollment). Transfer student applicants must have completed six semester hours/nine quarter hours of English composition, three semester hours/five quarter hours of quantitative reasoning (minimum grade of C), one course in Analyzing the Natural World that includes a laboratory, and one course in microeconomics. Additional transfer requirements include a minimum GPA of 2.75/4.00 scale, a phone or personal interview, and a personal statement of educational goals. Please review the College of Urban Planning and Public Affairs transfer guides for additional general education requirements.
