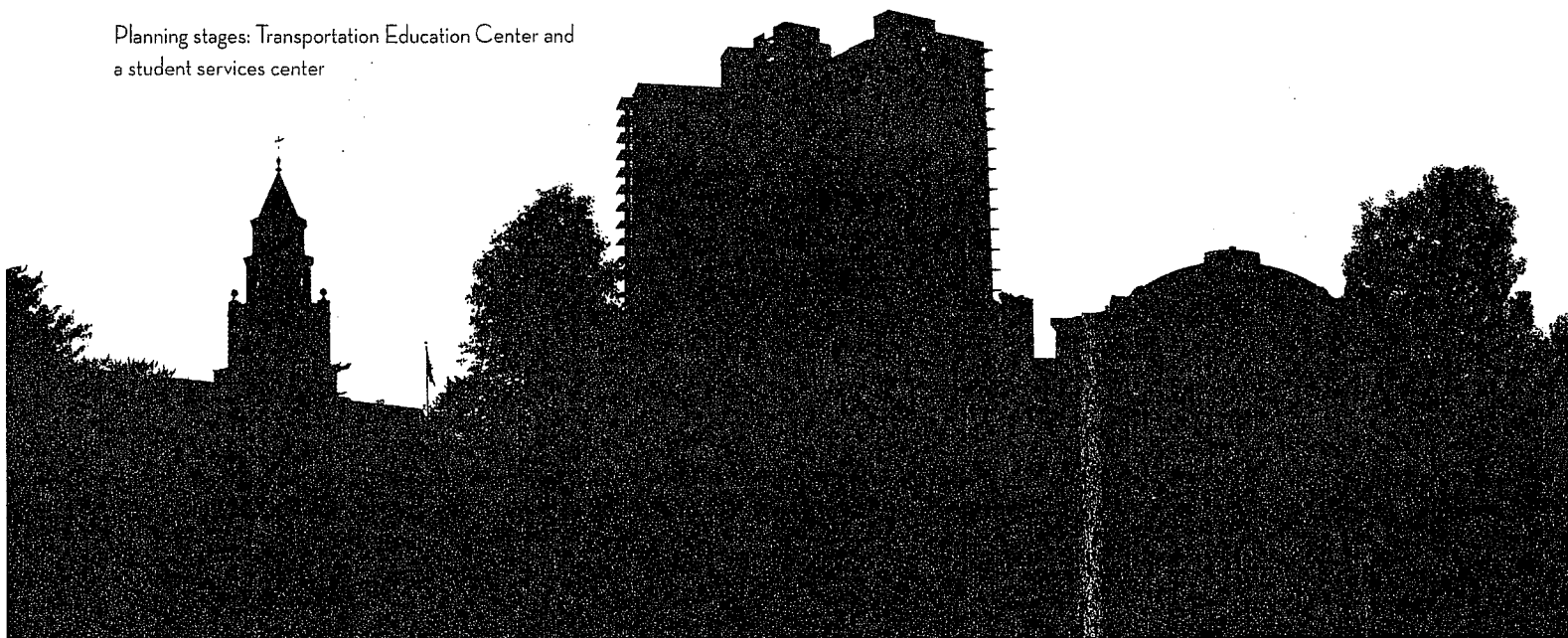

Tuition News

Southern Illinois University Carbondale offers rates equal to in-state tuition for new undergraduate freshmen and transfer students from neighboring states Arkansas, Indiana, Kentucky, Missouri, and Tennessee. The first semester tuition rate is locked in for 48 consecutive months. SIUC did not raise its tuition for the 2010-2011 academic year.



Enrollment Management Updates

- Transfer students need an overall GPA of 2.0/4.0 (as calculated by Southern) for general admission.
- Transfer students with fewer than 26 college-level semester hours must have a 2.0/4.0 overall GPA AND need to send their official high school transcripts and ACT or SAT test scores for review.
- Southern is offering an open house and orientation program specifically for transfer students on Friday, April 8, 2011.
- Dr. John Nicklow is the new Interim Assistant Provost.
- Southern accepts electronic transcripts through the following software: eScript-Safe, XAP, Docufide and ConnectEDU.
- Southern's Annual Community College Conference is Thursday and Friday, September 9 and 10, 2010.

Scholarships for Transfer Students

In order to be considered for merit-based transfer scholarships at Southern, students must be admitted to the University by February 1st of the year they plan to attend.

Southern Academic Scholarship Award:

- Students must graduate with an associate degree from a regionally accredited community college, and
- Students must have at least a 3.85/4.0 overall GPA as calculated by Southern, and
- Associate degrees must be awarded prior to starting classes at Southern.

Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship Award:

- Same requirements as the Southern Academic Scholarship Award, and
- Students must have been a member of Phi Theta Kappa for one academic year.

Illinois Community College Scholarship:

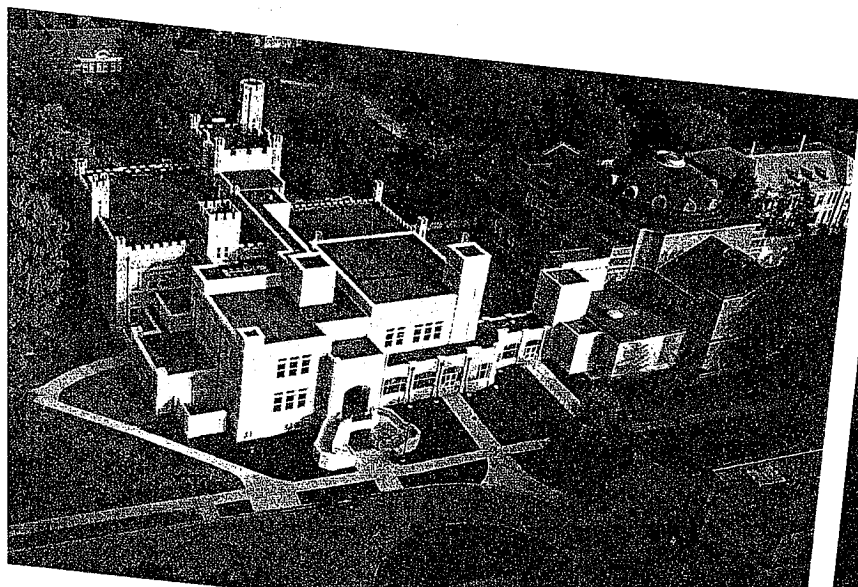
- Each Illinois community college is given the opportunity to recognize two of their outstanding students.

- Next, click on "Student" then "Student Records" and finally "Unofficial Student Academic Record". Select the level (transcript type is unofficial).

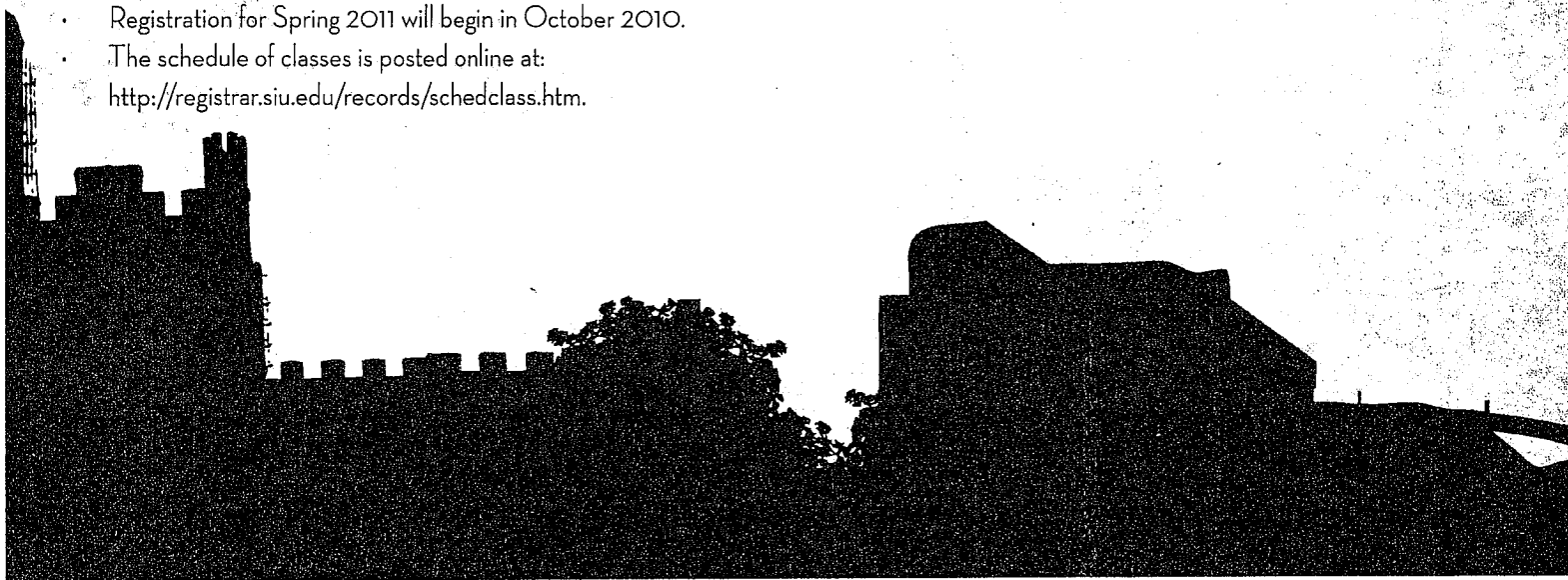

Six of these scholarships were available for the fall 2009 semester, and the monetary award is up to \$9,000 for two years.
